EXTRA-CURRICULAR CODE OF CONDUCT

Participation in extracurricular activities in Coppell ISD is considered a privilege, and higher standards are expected from all participants as it pertains to grades, behavior in and out of school, attendance, work ethic, and commitment. Any behavior that is deemed unbecoming of a participant may be subject to punishment by the coach or sponsor, but severe or persistent negative behavior may be considered a violation of the Extra-Curricular Code of Conduct whether at Coppell High School, New Tech High @ Coppell, or CHS9.

Violation of the Extra-curricular Code of Conduct may take place during school hours, en route to and from events, during school-sponsored events, or during non-school time.

VIOLATIONS

Violations to the Code of Conduct are as follows:

1. Behavior unbecoming of a participant that is either persistent OR a major violation of CISD Student Code of Conduct as determined by CISD administration.
2. Possession or use of alcohol, illegal drugs, or drug paraphernalia.

In order for a student to be considered in violation, one or more of the following must occur:

- A student must admit to the violation,
- A parent of the student must admit to the violation,
- A CISD staff member must witness a student in violation,
- A local agency report of a violation must be filed,
- A local agency of the law must make a verbal report of a violation,
- Evidence such as a photograph or video must be presented, or
- Evidence of involvement in a violation.



CONSEQUENCES

FIRST OFFENSE

The student will be suspended from the current or nearest competitive season or activity for a period of three weeks; AND will perform 15 hours of documented community service; AND will attend at least one session of counseling. The suspended student will follow the UIL No Pass/No Play guidelines as stated in the UIL C&CR and Side-by-Side.

SECOND OFFENSE

The student will be suspended from all extracurricular activities for a period of one calendar year. After the one-year period, a campus committee composed of the coach/sponsor, immediate supervisor, and building principal will determine reinstatement. The committee will review the student's academic record, attendance, behavior records, and any other information committee deems appropriate.

THIRD OFFENSE

The student will be permanently suspended from all extra-curricular activities for the remainder of their high school career.

OFFENSES WILL ACCUMULATE DURING STUDENT'S ENTIRE HIGH SCHOOL CAREER.
